## How to leave a gift

A solicitor can help you to write a Will or, if you already have a Will, a codicil. We will use your gift wherever it is most needed, or you can choose to support a specific aspect of our work. Your solicitor will need the following information:

Your solicitor will also talk to you about the type of gift you want to leave. There are three main types:

- A 'Residuary gift'.  
This is where you leave a percentage of your estate rather than a fixed amount. The benefit of this type of gift is that it retains its value over time.
- A 'Pecuniary gift'.  
This is for a specific amount of money.
- A 'Specific gift'.  
This is for gifts such as stocks and shares or property.
