Important information for travel authorities and their staff.

The bearer of this letter has a stoma.

What is a stoma?

A stoma is a surgically created opening in the abdomen through which the bowel and/ or bladder is diverted so that bodily waste can be collected in a bag. A stoma is a 'hidden' condition.

If you need to search the bearer, then please:

- · Be sensitive and empathetic.
- · Offer to conduct the search in a private room.
- · Do not separate the holder from their medical supplies as they may need them.
- · Allow the holder a chaperone.
- · Wear gloves.
